The Tuesday craft club took a different direction last month. The women decided that it was time that the men took a hands on role in the club, so George Pendlebury and I planned a craft activity for the children, I must say I really did enjoy the experience. I even helped with the painting.

The Tuesday Bible class is continuing to do well and I have had a lot of positive feed back and input from the class members. The discussion time has proved to be very fruitful and several people have opened up and asked that we pray for them.

The Lord has blessed us, last month Helen Chapman decided to place membership at West Mains. Gillian and I have known Helen for most of our lives and she will be a great asset to the church at West Mains. Please keep her in your prayers.

Hopefully I will have some good news on the building situation. I spoke to our local government official three weeks ago and told Alice that we were actively looking for a building of our own. Alice Mitchell has agreed to take up our case and she is currently trying to find us a piece of land that will suit our needs. Please pray that land will become available, there are so many other outreaches we can get involved in within the community by having our own place.

At this point in time all our AIM students have returned home and we are waiting to hear if we are to get another team next May so I would ask you to keep this in your prayers also.
